PART I PRELIMINARY PROVISIONS

Citation	1. These Regulations may be cited as the Merchant hipping (Medical Examinations) Regulations, 2023.				
Application	 2(1) Except where expressly provided otherwise, these Regulations shall apply in respect of giving effect to the International Convention on Standards of Training, Certification and Watchkeeping of 1978 as amended and the Maritime Labour Convention, (MLC 2006) as ammended. (2) Without prejudice to the generality of subregulation (1), these Regulations shall apply to-

APPOINTME	PART II ENT, QUALIFICATIONS AND PREMISES OF MEDICAL

APPOINTMENT, QUALIFICATIONS AND PREMISES OF MEDICAL PRACTITIONER

Appointment of medical practitioner 4.-(1) The Corporation may appoint a medical practitioner for the purpose of conducting examination of seafarer or master for determining medical fitness.

(2) Subject to subregulation (1), a medical practitioner appointed shall have a practise experience of not less than five years.

(3) A medical practitioner who wishes to be

appointed shall submit to the Corporation the following documents-

- (a) relevant academic certificates; and
- (b) a certificate of registration issued by the relevant medical accreditation body.

(4) The Corporation may, in verifying the authenticity and validity of the documents submitted in support of the application, require the medical practitioner to provide additional information as it may deem necessary.

(5) The Corporation shall enter into a written agreement with appointed medical practitioner in relation to administration and provision of seafarer medical examination.

5.-(1) The appointment of a medical practitioner may be suspended or cancelled in writing by the Corporation-

- (a) based on the recommendation made in an investigation or audit report by the relevant authority;
- (b) when a medical practitioner transfers or relocates his medical practice to a different premise or facility without notifying the Corporation;
- (c) where, in the opinion of the Corporation, the circumstances warrant such, suspension or cancellation;
- (d) upon the medical practitioner registration being invalidated by the relevant medical accreditation body; or
- (e) where the medical practitioner fails to comply with these Regulations.

(2) Where the Corporation decides to suspend or cancel the appointment of the medical practitioner, it shall issue a thirty days written notice.

(3) In the case of suspension the Corporation shall specify the period of suspension or the conditions upon which fulfilment shall lead to uplifting of suspension.

6.-(1) Examination of medical fitness of seafarer or master shall be conducted in a premise which is registered by the relevant authority.

(2) The premises shall have the facility and equipment required to carry out medical fitness examination and be conveniently situated for ease of access.

(3) The Corporation shall conduct inspection of the premises and facility to verify suitability in conducting medical fitness examination.

Transfer of location

7.-(1) A medical practitioner who intends to transfer his services to another location shall inform the Corporation in writing not less than five days of such changes.

(2) The Corporation shall, upon receipt of the information in subregulation (1), conduct verification of the premises or facility within fourteen days.

PART III

MEDICAL FITNESS CERTIFICATE

Employment of seafarer

8.-(1) A ship owner or master shall employ a seafarer who holds a valid medical fitness certificate appropriate for the area in which the ship is to operate or for the job on which seafarer is to be employed as prescribed in the First Schedule.

(2) A seafarer shall be considered to be medically fit where-

- (a) he has a valid medical fitness certificate;
- (b) there is no evidence that his medical condition has changed since the previous medical examination to an extent that would make him unfit to perform his duties as required; or
- (c) it is proved that he holds a recent expired medical certificate and it is possible for the seafarer to be examined and obtain a medical fitness certificate at the next port of call.

(3) Where the medical fitness certificate of a seafarer expires during the course of a voyage, a ship owner or master may continue to employ the seafarer-

- (a) for a period not exceeding three months from the date of expiry of the medical fitness certificate, or
- (b) until the next port of call where the seafarer can be examined and obtain a medical fitness certificate, provided that he holds a recent expired medical certificate,

whichever comes earlier.

(4) The Registrar may permit a seafarer, who is the holder of a medical fitness certificate which expired within a month before the date on which the seafarer joined a ship to which these Regulations apply, to be employed despite the expiry of the certificate, until the next port of call where a seafarer shall obtain a medical fitness certificate in accordance with these Regulations:

Provided that, the period of such permission shall not exceed three months.

(5) A ship owner or master who contravenes the

provisions of subregulation (1) commits an offence and upon conviction shall be liable to a fine of not less than two thousand United States dollars or its equivalent in Tanzania shillings.

Eligibility to obtain medical fitness certificate 9.-(1) A seafarer or master who intends to obtain medical fitness certificate shall-

- (a) be at least 18 years of age
- (b) provide satisfactory proof of seafarer identity; and
- (c) be medically examined to ascertain his fitness, having regard to the medical standards as specified in regulation 10.

(2) Notwithstanding the provision of subregulation (1), a seafarer under the age of 18 years but above 16 years may obtain a medical fitness certificate for the purpose of onboard training.

(3) The medical fitness certificate shall-

- (a) be in English language and in a format as set out in the First Schedule; and
- (b) provide information whether an applicant is fit or unfit to carry out the work of a seafarer for which he is employed.

(4) Where colour vision is in doubt, the medical practitioner may, having regard to the duties to be performed at sea by the seafarer or master, proceed to conduct the confirmatory colour vision test-

- (a) using a centre designated by the Corporation; and
- (b) in accordance with the eyesight minimum standards for seafarer or master.

Standard of medical fitness

10.-(1) The medical examination of seafarer or master for issuance of Medical Fitness Certificate shall consider the standards for-

- (a) eyesight and vision; and
- (b) hearing.

(2) Subject to the provisions of subregulation (1), the standards shall be as set out in the Second Schedule these Regulations.

(3) The eyesight and colour vision test carried out shall be valid for a period not exceeding six years.

(4) The Corporation may designate a place for a referral centre for the purposes of assessing colour vision in order to provide a medical practitioner with the information necessary to issue medical fitness certificate.

Validity of

11. The validity of medical fitness certificate shall be

certificate	as follows:
	 (a) for a seafarer who has not attained the age of eighteen years, for a period not exceeding one year; and
	(b) for a seafarer who has attained the age of eighteen years, for a period not exceeding two years.
Possession of medical fitness certificate	12. A seafarer or master who has been issued with a medical fitness certificate shall-
	 (a) ensure that the original certificate is in his possession at all times when on board during the term of his employment; and
	(b) produce the certificate when requested to do so by an inspector or surveyor.
Recognition of medical fitness certificate issued by other State	13. A medical fitness certificate issued by the authority of the Government of other State giving effects to the provisions of the STCW Convention or a State specified in a Merchant Shipping Notice shall be equivalent to a medical fitness certificate issued under these Regulations.
Suspension or	14(1) The Corporation may-
cancellation of medical fitness certificate	(a) suspend the certificate until such time the seafarer has undergone further medical examination and being approved accordingly;
	(b) suspend the certificate for such reasonable period that the seafarer will remain unfit to go to sea as recommended by medical practitioner; or
	(c) cancel the certificate where the medical practitioner recommends that the seafarer will remain permanently unfit to go to sea.
	(2) The Corporation shall suspend or cancel the certificate where it has reasonable grounds to believe that-
	(a) there has been a significant change affecting the
	medical fitness of a seafarer or master during the period of validity of his medical fitness certificate; and
	 (b) a medical fitness certificate was issued to a seafarer or master otherwise than in accordance with these Regulations. (2) When the Constraint of the seafarer of
	(3) Where the Corporation suspends or cancels a certificate under this regulation, it shall notify the seafarer or
	master of the decision in writing.
	(4) The Corporation shall direct a seafarer or master
	whose certificate has been suspended or cancelled under

subregulation (1) to surrender the certificate to the Corporation within seven days.

(5) In the case of suspension, the Corporation shall specify the period of suspension or the conditions upon which fulfilment shall lead to uplifting of suspension.

Certificate of competency or proficiency 15. A medical fitness certificate issued under these Regulations shall be accepted as evidence of medical fitness for a seafarer or master seeking award or revalidation of a certificate of competency or certificate of proficiency.

PART IV

OFFENCES AND PENALTIES

Offences under these Regulations

16.-(1) Any person who contravenes the provisions of these Regulations by-

- (a) employing a seafarer who does not have a valid certificate appropriate for the area where he shall work on the ship;
- (b) produce incorrect information or incorrect documents;

commits an offense and if he is convicted he will be liable to pay a fine not less than the value of Tanzanian Shillings equal to five thousand US Dollars or imprisonment not exceeding six months or both.

(2) A medical practitioner who issues a medical fitness certificate-

- (a) without been appointed by the Corporation;
- (b) when his appointment to provide services to seafarers has been terminated or cancelled by the Corporation,

commits an offense and if he is convicted he will be liable to pay a fine not less than the value of Tanzanian Shillings equal to five thousand US Dollars or imprisonment not exceeding six months or both.

(3) A seafarer or master who fails to comply with the provisions of these Regulations commits an offence and upon conviction shall be liable to a fine of not less than two thousand United States dollars or its equivalent in Tanzania Shillings.

General penalty 17. Where a person commits an offence under these Regulations for which no specific penalty is prescribed, such person shall on conviction be liable to the penalty prescribed in the Act.

PART V GENERAL PROVISIONS

Quality standards system	 18(1) The Corporation shall monitor medical certification activity through the Quality Standards System (2) The Quality Standards System shall establish minimum procedures for-issuance of medical certificates; appointment of a medical practitioner; and review of the decision of the Corporation.
Seafarer or master medical record	 19(1) Copies of the seafarer or master medical certificates shall be kept in the files of the medical practitioner premises or facility in which it was issued and clearly marked as confidential and retained. (2) Medical examination records shall- (a) be kept confidential; (b) be used for determining the fitness of the seafarer or master for work and for enhancing health care; (c) be made available only to person duly authorized; and (d) not be used for any purpose other than facilitating the treatment of a seafarer or master. (3) The medical record shall not be disclosed to any other person without prior written consent of the seafarer or master.
Register of medical practitioners	20(1) The Corporation shall-
	 (a) keep and maintain a Register which shall contain particulars in respect to medical examination for purposes of these Regulations; and (b) make the Register available on request, to any State, company, seafarer. (2) The particulars in the Register referred to under subregulation (1) shall include- (a) particulars of medical practitioner appointed under these Regulations; and (b) name of States whose certificates are recognised by the Corporation.
Complaint handing	21(1) A seafarer or master who is aggrieved by the decision under regulation 14 may apply to the Corporation for the matter to be reviewed by a medical referee as prescribed in the Third Schedule.

(2) Subject to subregulation (1), the application for review shall be submitted to the Corporation within thirty days from the date on which the decision was issued.

(3) The Corporation shall, upon receipt of the application for review, consider the application and communicate its decision to the applicant within fourteen days.

Revocation and savings GN. No. 244 of 2016 22.-(1) The Merchant Shipping (Medical Examination) Regulations are hereby revoked.

(2) Notwithstanding subregulation (1), a medical fitness certificate issued to a seafarer or master under the Merchant Shipping (Medical Examinations) Regulations shall continue to be in force until the expiry date specified in the certificate.
